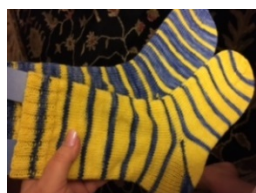
KNITTING PROJECT DESCRIPTIONS

Fingering Weight Asymmetrical Lace Mitts

Lace. Fingering weight yarn. Straight or circular needles. A clever design that one minute is cool fingerless mitts and the next moment is stylish lace cuffs. Interested? Take this class and learn how to read a lace chart and combine common stitches to create a project that will add a bit of flare to any outfit. *Prerequisite: knit, purl, increase, decrease.*

Class Limit: Minimum 5; Maximum 15.



Socks 102

So you have made a pair of socks. Or maybe two or three pairs. But you want to learn more. More tips and tricks. New and different techniques.

Take this class and broaden your sock horizons... and maybe even have a laugh or two.

Prerequisite: knit, purl, increase, decrease.

Modular Knitting

Modular knitting, also called domino or patchwork knitting, is a way to create fabric one piece at a time, joining as you go. This is a great technique for stash-busting or for showing off multicolored yarns. We will explore easy ways to create different geometric shapes. Many pieced quilt patterns can be reproduced in knitting using this method. *Prerequisite: knit, purl, double decrease.*

Class Limit: Minimum 5; Maximum 15.



Embroidery, Edgings and Embellishment for Knitting

Come explore the possibilities of enhancing your knitwear with both knitted-in and surface decoration. From knitted braids and I-cord to flowers and leaves, as well as embroidery techniques, learn how to add character and pizzazz to your beautiful knitted creations. (We will dip our toe into a bit of crochet as well, but no previous knowledge of crochet is needed.) *Prerequisite: knit, purl, increase, decrease.*

Class Limit: Minimum 5; Maximum 15.



Fingering Weight Asymmetrical Stranded Hat

What to turn up the notch a bit on your stranded colorwork experience? Try this class. Finer gauge yarn and an asymmetrical design will not only give you a bit of a challenge (not a lot... just a bit) and also give you a finished accessory with a different look than typical Fair Isle knitting. We'll work with reading colorwork charts and using markers to help keep things all sorted out. *Prerequisite: knit, purl, increase, decrease.*

Class Limit: Minimum 5; Maximum 15.
